We are so happy to announce that Denise from the January newsletter has now been adopted with another cat from The Tenth Life. They have a loving "Mom and Heart-Warming Story Dad" and enjoy chasing each other through the house. They are best friends even though they did not know each other at The Tenth Life. We are extremely happy for both of them and, of course, for their new parents.

From the last newsletter Shelly and Leonard have not been adopted, but Archie has been adopted to a couple and is enjoying his new life as a spoiled, only cat. He loves to play and be loved. He is a lucky kitty.



Our new feature cats are Tonka, a handsome Siamese mix and Twinkle, a very sweet mostly white female. Tonka was a stray in a colony of cats. There were five Siamese and one tiger. They were all semi-feral, but most could be touched. Tonka is the friendliest and loves to give head bumps. He is about two years old and a very loving cat. He gets along well with other cats and loves to play.

Our second cat is Twinkle. She is about the same age. She has a few gray spots on her body, but is mostly white. She loves to play, but her favorite pastime is sitting on laps. She loves to be cuddled. Twinkle literally purrs constantly when receiving attention.

Our story for this newsletter is about a cat named Benny. He had lived at The Tenth Life for most of his life. He was a handsome cat, but was born feral and was

still shy when people visited his room unless he knew them. A couple came looking for a declawed cat as a friend for their female cat at home. They saw Benny and liked him, but he was under a bench peeking out at them. The husband sat on the floor, and in a couple of minutes, Benny cautiously came out for petting. He loved the attention and won a home of his own. His new sister did not like him at first but now they are inseparable. He hid for a while, but started coming out to view his new surroundings. His new "Mom" has sent several videos of his adventures around the house. He has started jumping onto laps, but is still too shy to stay for very long. He has made such remarkable improvements. His parents love him so much and are so thrilled to have him as their new family member.

Eulogies

Since late last year, we have lost three of our elderly cats that lived in the health care facility. We lost Buford, the large, loving, black cat, Andre, the gray and white boy, and Inigo, the three-legged boy. Buford died of cancer, Andre died of renal failure, and Inigo, who was diabetic, passed away unexpectedly. Buford, who was fifteen, had multiple intestinal cancers and had lost weight. He was one of the sweetest, most laid-back cats. He loved everyone and loved to be held on his back like a baby. He would pat your face with his front paws. He was so gentle with the other cats. Buford was a very special boy!!

Andre, was also about fifteen, and was a great cat with an ornery streak. If a door was shut, he had to run into that room as soon as it was opened. Andre played with other cats and would cuddle with them for long naps. He loved to sleep on the surgery table, when not in use, and get warm from the surgery light. He was best friends with Dr. Jennie. They had a special bond. Andre would get on the autoclave to sleep or watch out the window. More than once we caught him sleeping while still setting upright. He had arrived as a kitten with a broken hip. Dr. Jennie removed the ball from the hip socket, and he was as good as new. He almost never limped unless he was really tired from his busy day. Andre was another very special boy.

Inigo was our original health care facility cat. He was found at the age of about three months with a broken and paralyzed front leg. The leg could not be saved and was amputated by Dr Jennie. We were in the process of building our health care facility and decided that he would be our cat for that facility. The year was 1999. When the building was completed, he moved in and remained until May 2016. He was to be a donor cat for blood transfusions, but he decided that he did not like the job and refused to share his blood. We kept him in the facility anyway because he was such a sweet-tempered, great cat. He loved everyone whether you were a person or a cat. He had become diabetic a few years ago, but was pretty well controlled the entire time. He was sleeping more but most cats his age do that. Even the night before he died, he was acting completely normal and asking for attention. I even told him he was a perfect cat, so well-behaved and so loving. It was a total shock to find, upon our arrival, that he had passed away. He was seventeen and very loved.

We truly miss our three special friends who had been with us for many years. They enriched our lives, made us laugh, and made us very grateful to have known and loved them.

Exciting News

We had wanted for a long time to purchase a digital x-ray system. For many years the price was so prohibitive that we had to wait to make the purchase. With technologies advancing so quickly, and prices being reduced accordingly, we thought that in the near future, we would be able to possibly make the purchase. As time passed, our existing system had become so inadequate that the x-rays were difficult to read. We knew that we would need to make the purchase sooner than we had anticipated. When we talked to our equipment representative, he promised to try to find a special deal for us. As it was the end of their fiscal year, they were in a position to make a better price offer to us. We saved over ten percent on the purchase with a threemonth delay for paying for the system. This enabled us to purchase the digital system now so that we can have high-quality readable x-rays for the doctor.

Flea Control

Flea season is in full swing. With the hot, humid weather that we have been having, fleas are everywhere. It is important for your cat and for you to stay ahead of the fleas. There are many products available over the counter, but unfortunately, too many of them are ineffective and dangerous for your cat. The only really reliable and safe product for cats available over the counter is Advantage, which is only for flea control. The products that we use and are effective are only available from veterinarians. They are **Revolution** or Advantage Multi Cat. Both of these products, not only disease. Both are monthly treatments and can be used for kittens over nine weeks and adult cats. They not only kill adult fleas but prevent flea eggs from hatching for one These products are applied topically. month. We suggest applying the treatment on the back of the head rather than at the shoulder blades to prevent the cat from licking the spot and ingesting the solution. It is not considered dangerous for the cat to lick the application spot; however, the cat will likely begin drooling if it does lick the spot.

If fleas are not prevented or eradicated from your cat, the cat may become anemic from the fleas. The fleas live by sucking your cat's blood. Anemia can lead to many problems for your cat, such as lethargy and make your cat more susceptible to other illnesses. The immune system of the cat will be weakened. Some pets are very allergic to fleas and will lick their fur causing bald spots which will require more treatment.

If fleas get into your house, they can cause many problems for you and be difficult to get under control. If fleas get into your carpet, you will need to vacuum often and remove the bag immediately. The fleas can live in the vacuum bag and reproduce. You will have an infestation almost immediately. Before you vacuum, you can sprinkle Sevin Garden Dust on the carpet and vacuum it up when you run the sweeper. It is effective for killing fleas. Many people are allergic to fleas and will develop a rash from the flea bites. Prevention of fleas is very important for both your cat and for you.

Search for a New Veterinarian

Our search for a new veterinarian continues. The doctor who has been helping us one day every other week, will soon be leaving permanently. She is moving out of state, and we will not have a veterinarian to help us at all. We have a desperate need to find a veterinarian immediately. We have interviewed another applicant and would be excited to have her as a member of our organization. She has several years of experience and seems extremely qualified. However, she has a couple of other interviews before she makes a decision. We share the same philosophies about cats and their needs. We are for flea control, but also for treatment and control of still have our ads running and will continue looking for a ear mites and round worms, and prevention of heartworm new doctor to take care of the cats of The Tenth Life if she does not accept our offer.

Status of the Three Dollar Campaign

We had jewelry, clothing, gift baskets for humans and animals, cat and dog food, cat litter, household utensils, and hundreds of other items for your buying pleasure. There is no reason to think we will have less this year as The Tenth Life volunteers are currently soliciting this year's treasures. As part of the festivities, we have a 50/50 raffle with half the money going to the cats and half to the winning human. We will have a bake sale as part of the event. It will feature cake(s), cookies, and other treats to temp your senses. We will need more bakers to help us with the sale. Our main baker who moved to Tennessee will not be able to help with this bake sale because of other obligations. If you can help, we would really appreciate your support. The bake goods can be brought to the VFW on Saturday from 9:00am - 5:00pm or on Sunday from10:00am - 1:00pm. We will also need baked goods for the dessert table for the dinner. Thanks for your help.

Meijer Community Rewards Program

We have been informed that Meijer has discontinued their Community Rewards Program effective June 30th. The Community Rewards Program was never very profitable for The Tenth Life. We only received about one hundred dollars every quarter. The problem with that program was that you had to use cash, check, or their credit card for your purchase to count for your charity. For people who used any credit card, other than Meijer's, their purchase did not add to the contribution to the charity.

They are offering a gift card program as an alternative to this program. We had been promised information on this program prior to the discontinuation of the Rewards Program, however, we have not received any information. When we know more about this program, we will decide if it will be beneficial to The Tenth Life, and notify you accordingly.

Past Fund Raisers

There have been two fund raisers since the last newsletter. The first was the annual plant sale. We sold

almost twenty-eight thousand dollars of annual bedding plants, hanging baskets, flowering and patio pots, herbs, vegetables, and perennials. All the plants were sold. The sale produced nearly eleven thousand dollars of income for the cats. As always, the plants were large, beautiful, and healthy and were provided by Furst Florist and Garden Center. We thank them for working with us again for this sale. This year's sale was again the largest and most profitable. We exceeded last year's sale by about eleven hundred dollars. With your help, we should be able to make the next sale even larger. We thank all of our customers, whether you preordered or bought from our extras, for making this a huge success for the cats. Our volunteers worked so hard sorting and checking the orders. We thank all of them for their hard work and dedication to the cats. Hope to see all of you at the next sale. Please remember to tell your friends and family about the plant sale.

The second fund raiser during this period was our participation in the Yellow Springs Street Fair. We thank the village for allowing us to participate in this event. Our sales were lower this year than in previous years. We made six hundred and eighty dollars for the cats, but last year our sales were about three hundred higher. The weather was extremely hot, and the crowd seemed to be smaller, probably because of the temperature. We think the weather was the main factor for the reduced sales. We thank our volunteers who worked in the heat and helped the customers. We appreciate all of our customers who made purchases and helped the cats. We plan to be at Street Fair in October.

Current Fund Raisers

We are still saving for the burglar alarm system. One individual made a sizable donation to this fund which should allow us to acquire the system sooner than anticipated. We are excited about this possibility. The system will provide security for the cats and peace of mind for the rest of us. We are still investigating different systems and are weighing the pros and cons of each system. Many of the systems that are available cannot accommodate our facility because of our size. We will find the best system for the cats. One of the options that the alarm companies offer is fire alert monitoring. The quotations we have gotten from these alarm companies are extremely prohibitive. Nearly three times the cost of the burglar alarm system alone. As much as we would like to have that coverage, it is currently beyond our reach. We will continue to negotiate with these businesses to see if it can be added later when we have accumulated enough cash to add the fire coverage. Thanks for helping.

Reminders

Please remember that kitten season is still on-going. Encourage everyone to spay/neuter their cats. It is the only answer to this horrible problem. Please offer your assistance, in any way that you can, to help people have their cats spayed/neutered. Remember the low-cost programs available in our area.

We appreciate your saving ink cartridges, Fresh Step Paw Points, pennies, coupons, and aluminum for the cats. We redeem the ink cartridges for rewards to purchase office supplies, paper towels, Clorox wipes, etc. This saves us dollars from the general fund for more important purposes.

The Paw Points can be found on the bag or box of Fresh Step Litter. The code is ten characters, but is not the lot number. Simply cut off the top layer of the bag or box with the code and mail it to our post office box. **Please be sure to cut off the entire code.**

The pennies can be wrapped or not. We are thrilled to get them either way. Pennies do add up and eventually turn into dollars for the cats' needs.

Sending coupons for Fresh Step Litter, cat food, Yesterday's News Litter, paper towels, toilet paper, wipes (Lysol or Clorox), and facial tissue save dollars when we shop for supplies.

The aluminum can be any type of aluminum from cans (pet food or soft drink) to siding and spouting. Canned vegetable cans are steel, not aluminum, and we do not recycle them. A magnet will not stick to aluminum, but will to other metals.

Any of these can be brought to The Tenth Life during our hours of operation. Of course, the ink cartridges, Paw Points, and coupons can be sent to the post office box. Please keep saving and helping the cats.
