Our new feature cats are a litter of three kittens, Winkin, Blinkin, and Nod (eight months), Bubba who loves other cats, and Snickers, who needs to be an only cat



Winkin, Blinkin, and Nod arrived when they were about nine weeks old. They were born to a feral Mom but were handled from the time they were born by the person who found them. Winkin is tiger, Blinkin is tortie, and Nod is black. They are all short hair and very sweet. They love to play and then crash and burn for long naps. They are typical kittens and have never met a stranger. They would add such fun and joy to your home.

Bubba is about three years old and was feral when he arrived with five Siamese from a parking lot. He would strike at anyone who tried to clean his cage. In a short time he was the lovey one. He is short and round and has handsome tiger markings. He enjoys sitting on laps and cuddling with the other cats. His favorite spot is on top of the cat tree, often with one of the Siamese he knows.

Snickers (2 years) is the last kitty for this newsletter. She was found as a stray in Beavercreek. At first she was feisty with everyone, but now is great with people but still is not very fond of other cats. She is positive that they are inferior to her. Snickers is a small cat and has beautiful tiger stripes. She likes to be petted and will climb onto laps for quiet conversations.

Of course, all are spayed/neutered, fully vaccinated, blood tested, and microchipped. The adoption fee is seventy-five dollars and adoptions are done by appointment. All the kitties are waiting for great homes.

Heartwarming Story

Our heartwarming story for this newsletter is about two ferals that were adopted together during the spring. They were Lyn and Sybil, or as they are now named, Gus and Greta. They had come to The Tenth Life separately, after being trapped but lived in the same room. Lyn came with his brother and mother and Sybil came by herself. They were both terribly wild and aggressive. Neither had been touched before arriving. All the volunteers worked with them to gain their confidence and help them adjust. After moving to their room, they hid and were terrified again from living in a cage to being loose in a room with other cats. They were both fine with the other cats. Of course they arrived in the room at different times. Lyn had learned to accept petting and would even jump in a lap on occasion. Sybil was too afraid to do that. She stopped hiding, but never really went to visitors for petting.

A woman who had adopted from The Tenth Life previously, came to adopt. She looked at all of the cats, but fell in love with Sybil, who was sitting on a window sill behind the cat tree, and Lyn who was cautiously coming for pets. She decided Lyn and Sybil would be her new cats and was willing to work with them and give them plenty of time to adjust to a new environment. She took them home and introduced them to their new room and their new home. Because they were so shy, we agreed that one room was a better choice than giving them access to the entire house at first. She was very patient with them and worked with them every day to help them acclimate to their new surroundings. After a while, she began letting them out of the room so they could examine the entire house. Unfortunately, Lyn slipped out of the house and was missing for eleven days. After trying for six days to find him, she called us and gave us the bad news. We offered a humane trap to use to capture him. She used the trap for four days without success, but on the morning of the fifth day, he was in the trap at

daylight when she checked it. She and her husband carried the trap into the house and into the cats' room. When they opened the trap, he ran out into the room and was terrified. Sybil saw him and seemed to wonder why a new cat had entered her room. He no longer smelled like Lyn but rather the outdoors. Of course, she hissed at him and made him even more afraid. After about a day of readjusting to their room, Lyn decided that he would now act like any other cat and be lovable. He was undoubtedly so happy to be back inside and safe. He no longer acted afraid or feral. Sybil disliked him for a couple of days but then decided that he was indeed the same cat who had shared the room before his escape. They decided that they liked to be petted on their terms. Sybil is still cautious and will only accept being petted when she feels completely safe, but Lyn thinks that being petted is the best thing in the world. They now have access to the entire house and a large sun room where they love to take long naps in the sunshine that comes through the windows. They are both still afraid of new things and noises, but have made significant strides toward being well-adjusted, loving cats. Gus and Greta now have the good life.

Eulogy for Joe Boxer

Many of you have visited The Tenth Life and met Joe Boxer, our last dog. Joe was found running up and down the center line in front of the property many years ago as a young dog. Early his year, Joe began having problems with walking. We tried many different medications, but nothing seemed to help very much in the long run. We decided to take him to a neurologist in Cincinnati for an evaluation. He was diagnosed with a degenerative spinal problem that is very common in Boxers. We were told as time went on, his problem would become more severe, leading to his inability to even stand. We were also told that the problem would eventually affect his front legs. We considered buying a cart for him, but with the quickness of the progression, we decided that it would not be wise. In April, we had to make the difficult decision to end his life and his discomfort. That morning, we gave him all the treats that he wanted and sat with him for hours. We were petting him as the injection was being given. He passed peacefully as we all cried. We miss him

so much and his room is so empty when we pass through it. We think he enjoyed his life and all of the attention he received from the volunteers and visitors. He was a wonderful dog who brought much joy during his eleven years at The Tenth Life. Thank you Joe Boxer!!!

Cats' Christmas Wish List

After we close at night, the cats get very busy and work on their Christmas wish list. They have compiled their wishes so that we can pass them on to our supporters for holiday donations. They have five wishes. They are donations for three small pieces of specialized equipment, donations to the general operating fund, donations of supplies, more volunteers, and more sponsors for the cats.

The three pieces of equipment range in cost from fifty dollars to about three thousand dollars. All of the items involve the eyes. They are an Eye Surgery Pack (\$400), a

Tono Pen (\$3,000) which is used to check a cat's eye pressure, and a cobalt blue penlight (\$50) which is for examining eye ulcers.

The general operating fund is used for day-to-day expenses, such as food, litter, insurance, doctor's salary, etc. These are the funds that keep the organization operating. Your donations to this fund make it possible for the cats to live in a home environment until they can find a loving home for the rest of their lives. Please help.

The donation of supplies is always a generous way of contributing to the cats. The supplies that we use on a daily basis are paper towels, wet wipes, bleach, sponge mops and refills, postage stamps and canned cat food (Friskies, Iams, or Fancy Feast). They can be brought to The Tenth life during our hours of operation. These donations save the general operating fund.

There is always a need for more volunteers to care for the cats and perform other duties. The volunteers maintain the cats' rooms so that they are clean, and the cats are comfortable. Everyday the rooms are cleaned, litter boxes are scooped, food is added and water bowls are emptied, cleaned, and refilled. It takes about nine volunteers each day to maintain the rooms. The more volunteers we have, the more time the volunteers have to interact with the cats and provide attention. Most volunteers work for about two hours, but some spend more time depending on their availability. There is also a need for volunteers to work at our booth at festivals. We try to have shifts of volunteers rather than their having to work the entire day. If any of these volunteer opportunities appeal to you and work with your schedule, please call The Tenth Life. We can use more help.

The last request is for sponsors for more of the cats. Currently about two hundred of the cats have sponsors. The rest feel badly because they do not have a special person to be their friend. For only ten dollars per month, you can sponsor one of the cats and enrich his or her life. The cats with sponsors always feel special because they know that there are extra funds to help with their needs. Of course, all of the cats receive the same care, but the ones with sponsors believe they have special benefits. When you sponsor a cat, you receive a letter from the cat

about its background and its life at The Tenth Life. When **Pictures with Santa** the cat is adopted, you receive a letter informing you of the adoption, and an offer to sponsor another. This is a great way to help a cat and be a best friend to one individual cat. Please consider helping this way.

A wish from past years has finally been realized. The alarm system has been installed. Fortunately, we were able to not only provide for break-in protection, but also for fire protection. We truly appreciate everyone's donations who contributed to this fund raiser. We are so happy that the cats now have this system, and we all can feel more secure about their safety.

Request for Craft Items

With the holidays and our associated bazaars quickly approaching, we would like to request craft items for these bazaars. We can use any type of craft items, but cat related ones are great sellers. In years past, we had many supporters who made craft items, but many of those have moved or have stopped making crafts. A new selection of craft items would enhance our sales at these events.
