## Feature Cats

Unfortunately, only Evangeline from the October newsletter has been adopted. She is an only cat and loves that arrangement. John and George and Abe and Stan are still waiting for someone to fall in love with them and take them home.

Our new feature cats are littermates Peaches, Topaz, and Mango and Ostia. The three littermates are about five months old and are all girls. One of their litter has already been adopted. Peaches is a long-hair calico, Topaz is a long hair tortie/tiger, and Mango is a short hair black. They are super loving. They came from a terrible, dangerous environment, but have developed into playful, typical kittens. It would be wonderful if they could be adopted together, but that is probably not very likely. They will be wonderful pets.



Ostia is the next feature cat. She is about three years old and loves attention from humans, but not so much from other cats. She is a short hair that loves her privacy. She avoids the other cats in her room as much as possible. When a human enters, she turns every way to gain attention and receive pets. She is playful by herself until another cat tries to help and then she retreats to her favorite window or cat tree. She would give her new owner many hours of purrs.

All of these girls are spayed, tested for viruses, fully vaccinated, checked for parasites, and micro chipped. Please call to see these purr babies or any others at The Tenth Life. The adoption fee is only eighty-five dollars and any of the cats will enrich your life.

## Heartwarming Story

The heartwarming story for this newsletter is about a pair of kittens, Ember and Ash, who had a rough start like too many other kittens and cats. They came to The Tenth Life as orphan kittens found in a rough neighborhood in Springfield. If that was not bad enough, they were born with deformities. Ember's mouth was not properly aligned and Ash's rear legs were bowed. She could eat and he could walk, but not normally. Of course, they managed to adjust as they did not realize they were any different than any other cats. Their make-up was the norm to them. They were bottle-fed by a volunteer of The Tenth Life and did fine. When they arrived at The Tenth Life, they were spayed /neutered, and after healing, moved to the kitten room. They were featured on our Facebook page and remained in the kitten room for only a couple of days. A couple who had already looked at our cats and was trying to decide which ones to adopt, saw the post and came to visit these two. They immediately fell in love and decided these two would be their babies. They have gone home and are integrating with the couple's other cats and being given a great deal of love and attention. We are so appreciative that this couple was willing to give these somewhat handicapped babies a loving home. They are thrilled with these babies.

## Microchip Registration

We just wanted to remind anyone who has adopted a cat from The Tenth Life that the registration of the micro chip is a life-long enrollment and does not need to be renewed at any time. You will receive notification from Home Again, that seems to say that the enrollment has expired. If you keep reading the letter or email to the bottom, it will acknowledge that only the extra frills have expired, not the enrollment. The letter seems to say that

there is an annual cost for the enrollment, but it is only for the frills. Please do not be confused by this communication from Home Again. If you want to continue the frills that it itemizes, please do so. We just wanted to be sure that you understood their letter or email and knew that the registration never expires on the microchip.

## Kitten Season

Although kitten season never seems to end with the milder winters we have had the last few years, it supposedly runs from about March to October. Unfortunately, when winters are milder, cats seem to continue to go into heat year around. With the gestation period being only sixty-three days, cats can have a few litters each year. With so many un-neutered females and males, there is such a surplus of kittens, that so many adults and kittens are put to death only because they were born. This is a tragedy. Please have all of your cats spayed or neutered as soon as your vet will do the surgery. If done early enough, you can prevent the females from going into heat and becoming pregnant. We spay or neuter our cats at The Tenth Life at four months which is usually before the first heat cycle. Cats in heat are miserable and they make their owners miserable also. There are so many advantages to having the males and females neutered. Please see the top of page eleven for the advantages of spaying and neutering and the bottom of page eleven for the results of not neutering cats.

## Request for Help with Kittens

With kitten season, comes the calls for help for mom cats and kittens or for orphan kittens. We need volunteers to foster these needy cats. We can provide food and litter and, of course, any medications needed. At set times the foster brings the mom and kittens in for testing and vaccinations. After the kittens are weaned, the mom cat comes into The Tenth Life for spaying and is left for adoption. When the kittens reach the age of four months, they are brought in for spay or neuter and stay for adoption. Orphan kittens are kittens whose

mother has been lost or killed or refuses to nurse the kittens. Although feeding bottle babies is rewarding, it is also very time-consuming and can be heart wrenching. These babies are so fragile and need so much care. Newborns must be fed about every three to four hours, around the clock. You also have to make them pass urine and stool as they cannot do this at first. They have to be kept warm also as they cannot maintain their body temperature.

If you would like to begin fostering and/or bottle feeding, please contact us. The kittens need all the help we can provide. There are so many calls for help.

## Final Tally of 2025 Three-Dollar Campaign

With all of your wonderful donations to the Three-Dollar Campaign, we reached a final total of thirty-eight thousand dollars. These funds will be used for the day-to-day operation of The Tenth Life and will help so much with the rising costs of everything that we purchase for the cats. Your donations make our operation possible. Thank you from the cats and the volunteers.

## Giving Tuesday Donations

The donations to the Giving Tuesday campaign were unbelievable. The cats received over twenty-five

thousand dollars from this campaign. We understand that knowing that donations were being matched, encouraged people to give generously and they certainly did. Thank you so much to everyone who participated. Being able to announce it early in the newsletter, on Facebook, and on our web site, made it more visible to our supporters. It made supporters more aware and allowed more time for planning donations.

## New Purchases

With the generous donations we received, we were able to replace our ultrasound and centrifuge which had both died very recently. With end-of-year specials on equipment, we were able to replace both for about six thousand dollars. We were very grateful that we could obtain these necessary pieces of equipment without an impact on our general fund. Both of these are very important for the care and welfare of the cats for diagnostic purposes. Your help is so appreciated by the cats and the medical staff.

## Christmas Wish List

The first wish from the cats was more of them to find loving homes. Twenty-five more cats now have loving homes. It is wonderful to see these cats be adopted to homes where they will be loved for the rest of their lives. Many of the people who adopt from The Tenth Life send pictures of the cats enjoying their new lives in a comfy, loving home. We enjoy these picture so much. We would love to see even more of the cats be adopted and be happy. Please consider adopting a cat and enriching your life and theirs.

We now have three new people who have begun volunteering. We really appreciate their help and extra attention for the cats. There is still a need for more volunteers. Finding time to volunteer is difficult with everyone's busy schedule, however, we always find time for whatever activity is important to us. If you have been thinking of volunteering with The Tenth Life, please do not wait any longer and call today. The cats are begging for your help.

The third request was for donations to the general operating fund. The cats received donations of thirty-five thousand dollars to this fund. This is a huge amount and we appreciate receiving all of these donations, but that amount only covers the expenses for a short period of time. We are always having fund raisers to keep the operating funds at a manageable level. Your help is what makes it all possible. Thank you.

Donations to the emergency fund were appreciated. These are the funds that we use to help owners who cannot afford the necessary testing or treatment for their beloved pets. With the rising cost of veterinary care, many people who truly love their pets, cannot afford the cost of necessary treatment. If they contact The Tenth Life, we try to help in any way that we can. If it requires financial help, we tap this fund for the expense. This year, we received nearly six thousand dollars for this account. We thank everyone who donated.

As always, we received donations of food, litter, paper towels, cleaning wipes, bleach, toilet paper, etc. These donations save us shopping time and dollars. We appreciate this help also.

## Request for Baked Goods

Our supporters again answered our needs for baked goods for the Christmas bake sale. There were forty varieties of cookies, candy, cakes, and breads for our customers to choose and make a donation. The cats earned over five hundred dollars from these sales. Everything was so delicious. Our customers were impressed with the selection and everything sold. Thank you to everyone who contributed to the bake sale.

## Request for Craft Items for Bazaars

We thank everyone who donated items for the bazaars. We had a really nice selection of holiday and gift merchandise. Our customers were impressed with the quality and quantity of our merchandise. ## Annual Plant and Flower Sale

The order blank for the 2026 plant sale is included in this newsletter. With the cold weather, it is hard to believe it is time to begin thinking about your plant needs for the spring of 2026. The plants will again be provided by Furst Florist and Garden Center. They have always supplied the plants for the sale and are always the best plants available. Last year we sold over thirty-seven thousand dollars of plants. They were so beautiful, and the cost was competitive with other nurseries. They are not big box store plants, but rather are the highest quality, healthiest plants you can find. Please be sure to plan to buy your plants from The Tenth Life and tell everyone you know about the sale. Although the last sale was fantastic, we would love to do even better this year. Please help us by telling your friends and relatives about the fantastic plants. We will have the same great selection as in past years. There will be annual bedding plants of many varieties, hanging baskets, flowering pots, patio pots, perennials, herbs, and vegetables. We will need your order blanks with payment by **March 7<sup>th</sup>**. If you cannot meet this date, we will, of course, take your order any time. **Please do not ever feel that it is too late to order.** We ask for early orders to qualify for the early-order discount offered by Furst. This allows us to keep our prices lower to help our customers. We will always amend our order to accommodate your needs and wants. If you want plants that are not listed on the order blank, simply add them. If Furst has the plants, or can get them, we will have them for you. If you prefer, you can call us, we will check with Furst on the availability, and get back to you with the information. The new pickup plan that we instituted three years ago helped with the traffic congestion that we sometimes experienced. **If your last name begins with A to J, please come on Tuesday, May 5<sup>th</sup> between 4:00pm and 7:00pm. For last names K to Z please plan to come on Wednesday May 6<sup>th</sup> between 4:00pm and 7:00pm.** We hope this plan will continue to help with the congestion and make life easier for everyone. **If neither of these days work for your schedule, you can come any of the following**

**evenings during those hours or on the weekend.** The hours will be the same for each week night after that. The hours on Saturday will be 10:30am – 5:00pm and on Sunday from 10:30am – 5:00pm. Please only come during these hours so that we may assist you with your order. Many orders may look alike but may not be yours, and you could wreak havoc with our order system. We will be expecting your order. For those looking for extra plants, please remember that if you cannot find the plants that you want, let us know and we will gladly procure more plants from Furst. We want to sell as many plants as possible to help the cats and meet our customers' needs and desires. See you there.

If you would like to volunteer to help with the plant sale, we can always use more help. The plants are delivered on May 4<sup>th</sup>. After the plants have all arrived, we inventory the delivery and then start filling over two hundred orders. We can use help with these activities. By the end of Monday, all orders are accumulated and marked. On Tuesday morning, we begin checking the orders to make sure they were filled properly. As we all tire out during the day, it is easy to make mistakes when filling the orders. We correct any errors found to satisfy our customers. Beginning at 4:00pm on Tuesday, customers begin picking up their orders. We need help with getting peoples' order identified and carried to their cars and helping those who want to purchase plants from the extras. All help is truly appreciated by everyone working this event as it is a very labor-intensive effort for everyone working it.

## 2026 Lasagna Dinner and Auction

We are already beginning the planning for the 2026 lasagna dinner and auction. The location will be the same as 2024 and 2025. It is the American Legion Hall 598 at 5700 Kentshire Road in Kettering, approximately a block from the intersection of Whipp and Bigger Roads. This venue worked very well for us the last two years, and many of our supporters commented how much they liked the location and the layout. We have moved the event back to August. It will again be a Sunday event and the date is **August 9<sup>th</sup>**. Please plan to attend and have a great shopping experience.

There will be a huge selection of silent auction items. The times will remain the same 2:00–6:00pm with the preview beginning at 1:00pm. The admission fee will again be fifteen dollars which includes the meal and your ability to bid on auction items. It will include the delicious lasagna dinner, provided by Belmont Catering, including salad, bread sticks, dessert, and coffee or tea. Please remember to send in your order blank by the due date.

We have decided to forego the Easter bake sale. Without the lady who baked for our sales for years, we have had to ask our supporters to provide baked goods. The support for the Christmas bake sales has been fantastic; however, the donations for the Easter bake sale

last year were very limited. For this reason, we will not offer a bake sale this Easter.

## Dorothy Lane Market Good Neighbor Program

We have a nice selection of short (\$20.00) and long-sleeve (\$25.00) t-shirts, polo shirts (\$25.00) and sweatshirts (\$45.00). Currently, sizes are S/M/L/XL. Of course, we do not have every size in every color. They all have The Tenth Life logo embroidered across the chest or on the upper left chest on the front.

We have crocheted catnip mice and fish (\$5.00), turtles, octopi, and kickers, (\$6.00), small and large snakes (\$6.00 & \$8.00), small and large balls (\$3.00) and catnip door hangers (a crocheted ball on the end of a crocheted hanger) (\$6.00). Cats that do not normally like catnip love these toys because of the freshness of the catnip that is locally grown. Commercially made toys have very little catnip aroma for the cats as the catnip was harvested months before the toys reach the cats for their pleasure.

Pet Hair Magnets (\$15.00), and Furminators (\$35.00) are available for your pet needs. The Pet Hair Magnets are wonderful for removing pet hair, and the Furminators work wonders for grooming your pet and removing mats without the unpleasant tugging.

Our note cards are great for writing your friends or they make excellent gifts for your cat-loving friends. There are ten cards and envelopes for five dollars. The front of the card is a cat face, and the inside is blank for your note-writing pleasure.




